

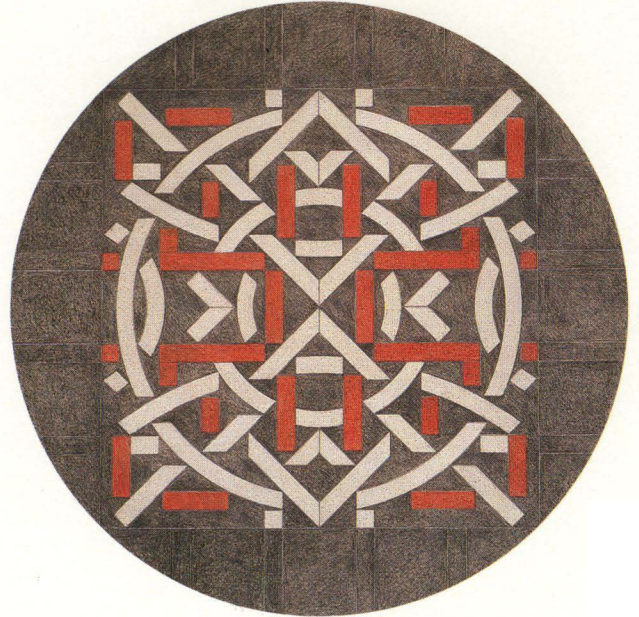
Title:

Location:  
Municipal Building and Police Plaza,  
New York City, adjacent to City Hall  
and the Brooklyn Bridge.

Project:  
A Site-specific paving plan for a  
3.5 acre site encompassing eight  
interconnecting plazas and courtyards  
around the Municipal Building,  
St. Andrews Plaza and Police Plaza.

Dimensions:  
Three and a half acres with a specific 34'  
diameter granite floor piece connected to  
the Municipal Building sidewalk and the  
axis leading to the Police Building. The  
Municipal Building (1912) is set apart  
from the fields of brick and granite and  
framed by a patterned brick sidewalk on  
the site of the original 22-foot wide  
granite block sidewalk.
